3. Boaz (*was, wasn't*) the closest living relative.

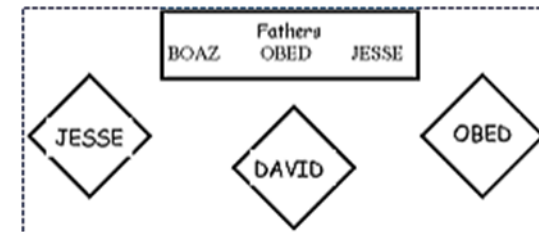
DAY 5 – Ruth 4:1-10

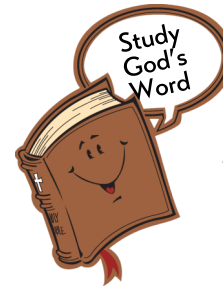

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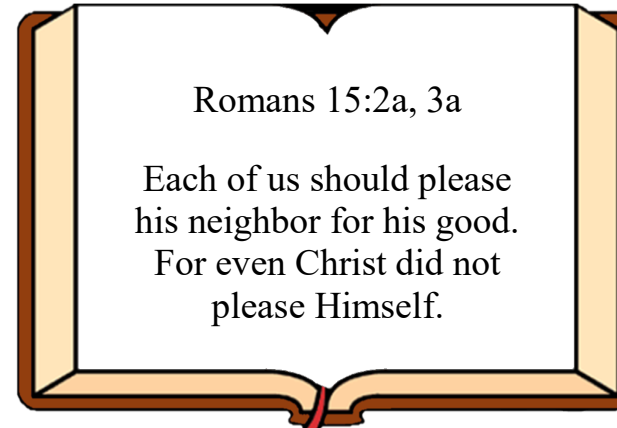
